FINAL PROGRAMME

The Hayes has excellent hygiene systems in place as you can see from [the booklet](#) they have produced. This comprehensive Covid Secure plan remains in place for your safety. It includes increased cleaning with rooms sanitised before arrival, extra space created in public areas, increased ventilation in meeting rooms and hand sanitisers available throughout the centre.

At present the wearing of a face mask is no longer required. However CTE's recommendation is that all Enabling Group members bring masks with them to use as appropriate, especially at registration. If you forget, masks are provided by The Hayes. You will need to wear a mask when singing.

CTE also recommends that you do a lateral flow test before travelling to the meeting. You can pick these up at no cost from most chemists or order them online. whilst at our venues.

Should you feel unwell whilst on site , please notify a duty manager, isolate and The Hayes staff will provide further guidance. Please also inform Jenny Bond by text (07708 929022).

The Hayes information

- Travel information is on the website [at the bottom of this page](#). If you are travelling by public transport, please note the useful tips in that document. We strongly encourage you to car-share as much as possible.
- There is plenty of parking at The Hayes and also two electric car charging points available in the main car park along the side of Lakeside (the first two on the left as you drive into the car park). Delegates need to pay a £10.00 deposit and they will receive £7.00 back when they return the key). It is not possible to pre-book the charging points.
- All bedrooms are en-suite and are situated in Lakeside or in the Main House. (All the rooms in the main accommodation block are now called Lakeside. If it is raining, it is possible to wend your way through the building to an exit onto the covered walkway.)

- On arrival from 12 noon, please register and collect your lanyard from the **Main House Reception**. You need this to access lunch. Luggage can be stored in the Main House luggage store (located to the left of the Main House Reception desk).
- Bedroom key cards will also be issued at **registration in the Main House Reception from 12 noon** and are programmed to give access to your room at 2.00 pm. Please don't even *think* of going early to your room unless you have been told otherwise, as this disrupts the housekeeping staff. Key cards also open external doors after 2.00 pm. Please ensure that external doors close firmly behind you and do not let anyone into the building as you enter.
- Your bedroom key cards do not give access to our meeting rooms but the planning team (or some of them, depending on how many organiser cards we are given) will be issued with organiser key cards which do open these rooms. It may be wise to ensure that you don't leave any valuables unattended in the meeting room in case it is left unlocked.
- The Hayes reception desk in the main entrance is usually staffed between 8.30 am and 10.00 pm. A Duty Manager is available from 7.30 am to 11.00 pm and overnight in case of emergency. They can be contacted by calling the number that will be left at Reception.
- If the fire alarm sounds, proceed to the Fire Assembly Point at the Main Conference Hall. This is also our main meeting room. (The Main Conference Hall is *not* the Derbyshire Hall but is the stand-alone building beyond the Butterley Hall, below the chapel.) Please do not return to the building until the Duty Manager has confirmed it is safe to do so.
- First Aid facilities can be accessed at Reception. If you are on any medication/have allergies which A&E might need to know about should you be unfortunate enough to end up there, please ensure information is in your pocket or handbag. It is also always useful to have [an ICE entry in your phone](#) and if your phone locks itself, on the lock screen.
- There is wifi throughout The Hayes. When logging on, click wifi and then insert your email address and tick the terms and conditions box. This will enable you to a free three-day personal quota.
- There is a gift shop in the Main House that stocks a range of greeting cards, gifts, confectionery, postcards, toiletries, Christian books, Fair trade products etc and this is usually open during morning coffee and afternoon tea. Please note cash is only accepted for payments under £5.00, card payments should be use when over £5.00.
- There is a guest laundry, off the Lakeside reception, fitted with a washing machine, tumble dryer and ironing station. A TV room is available in Lakeside.
- Our main meeting room will be the **Main Conference Hall**. This is not the Derbyshire Hall but the stand-alone building below the chapel and (if you are going uphill to the chapel) to the right of the building containing the dining room.)
- Be aware that there is only one pull down screen in the MCH and ppt slides need to be square.
- Please keep an eye on noticeboards, eg for the taxi/lifts offered list and other relevant information as we will be keeping announcements to a minimum.
- This is a paperless meeting. Bring with you anything you need printed out or have it ready on your tablet/laptop.

TUESDAY 28 SEPTEMBER 2021

Please arrive at the **Main House Reception area** in time to pick up your lanyard to access lunch at 1.00 pm. (Arrivals before 11 am attract a £12 charge; please don't come too early!)

Registration begins at noon and bedrooms will be available from 2.00 pm. Please be aware that we begin at 2.15 pm promptly but please do not even **think** of trying to access your room before 2.00 pm as we are able to distribute key cards in advance on the strict understanding that no-one tries to do that. Key cards won't work before 2.00 pm anyway. If you arrive late, your key card and lanyard will be waiting for you in the Main House Reception area.

With Callan Slipper, National Ecumenical Officer for the Church of England. He writes: Exploring the heart of ecumenism is an exploration of Christ who is the heart of Christianity. Indeed, the root of all roots both of the living experience of Christians and of ecumenism is the same: to dwell deep in the inner life of God exposed in Jesus' prayer on the eve of his death, his last will and testament: 'Father, may they all be one as you and I are one.' We will seek to discover how being in Christ as members of his body, opens before us new life, new challenges, new mission, and a new ecumenism. It is a return to the roots that hopes to help us flourish in the future.

12.30 pm The Agape (Love) Feast

Led by David Evans, Salvation Army NEO, and Leão Neto, Assistant Connexional Ecumenical Officer for the Methodist Church.

The Love Feast, or Agape, is a Christian fellowship meal recalling the meals Jesus shared with disciples, which expresses the *koinonia* or sharing, belonging and fellowship enjoyed within the Body of Christ. It is not the same as Holy Communion. The intention is to allow the participation of all present – from different denominations – who otherwise would not feel free to take Holy Communion together. Any Christian may conduct or take part in the Love Feast. It is for the whole congregation.
