A wide range of organisations and networks draws Christians of all churches together around common causes, projects and interests. These are the 45 Bodies in Association with the Churches Together in England and Churches Together in Britain and Ireland, schools of ecumenical living and working.

They do not form part of the churches' official structures but, as voluntary associations of Christ's people or movements within the Church, their participation in the churches' ecumenism and mission before the world is recognised and valued. They build relationships, increase ecumenical literacy and, with their rich range of resources, action, partnerships and focus, they serve the Church's ever greater unity. With a perspective from outside the governance of the churches to which their members belong, and often from a point of direct engagement with the changing conditions and needs of wider society, their insight also offers a refreshing addition to the churches' united working, creating new space for the Church's voice to be heard in the public sphere.

CCADD, recognising that Christians have long held widely differing views on the use of military force, does not prescribe a single approach, but provides a forum where scholars, officials, military personnel, clergy (including chaplains to the forces), peace-movement activists, and interested members of other faiths or none, can enter into dialogue with each other. Christian pacifists and defenders of "just war" are agreed on the need to search for the means to reduce international tension, and CCADD offers channels for disseminating ideas and knowledge, as well as the chance to talk to well-informed people on many key areas of conflict and their resolution.
